## Washi Tapes Dispenser

- A small cardboard box. (Size varies. See below.)
- Ruler
- Awl or drill with large bit.
- Decorative paper and/or paint
- Small 1/4" to 1/2" dowels. (Mine are 1/4")
- Glue
- Small metal hook for scissors

You can use whatever size box works best for however many Washi tapes you have. About 3.5" deep seems to be a good depth to trim it to.

The measurements will depend on your size of box. These are just estimates I used for my own box which was a nice size for my purpose. (12x8.75×3.5)


Paint or cover your box with paper as desired. Measure very carefully and mark where your holes will be. Make sure to allow for your Washi Tapes to hang free and not bump into the next row. My measurements worked perfect for small and normal size tape. I placed the small rolls on the top dowel which was spaced 2.5 ". For my normal size rolls I spaced the dowels $3.5^{\prime \prime}$ apart as shown.

I placed my holes about 1 1/2" in from the front. You want them a little bit closer to the front than the back for easy access.

You can use an awl to punch the holes but they are a bit small for $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ dowel. I used a drill for one of my dispensers as it made a cleaner hole. You want the dowel to be a snug fit.


You can glue on a hook to hold a small pair of scissors. I used a cup hook and pushed it in and glued it.
