

# Monster Eyeball Pong

GOAL: To remove all of the opponents cups from the table before they remove yours.

## Instructions:

1. Set cups in a triangle formation at each end of a table. The triangle should be pointing towards the opposing player and aligned with the edge of the table. Triangles can consist of 3 or 6 cups each, depending on how long of a game you want to play. The more cups, the longer the game.
2. Each player gets 2 eyeballs.
3. Set a bowl of candy aside. Players will receive a piece of candy for each successful throw.

## Play:

Each player is given two throws per turn. If playing in teams, allow both players on the first team to throw their eyeballs before alternating to the other team.

Players must attempt to throw their eyeball into the opposing team's cups. The opposing team may not interfere with the eyeball in any way. (Although trying to distract the opposing team is permitted so long as you don't touch the ball.)

Once the player/team has thrown all of their eyeballs in that turn, they can claim their prize. For each eyeball that lands in the opponent's cup, the player/team receives 1 piece of candy. Then that cup is removed from their opponent's triangle and it is now the opposing player/team's turn.

During your team's turn, if a second ball lands in a cup that already has a ball in it, you may take an additional piece of candy. (Two eyeballs in 1 cup = 3 pieces of candy. One piece for each eyeball and a BONUS piece for making it into the same cup).

## Variations (additional game play ideas):

1. In addition to your BONUS candy, when two eyeballs land in the same cup the person throwing the eyeballs may have the opposing team remove 2 cups instead of 1.

2. If the eyeball bounces on the table before it goes into a cup, the opposing team may then interfere with the eyeball to prevent it from going in.

3. If the eyeball bounces off of the cups and goes off the table, then the first team to grab it gets a bonus "re-throw".


4. If the opposing team interferes by touching the ball when they are not supposed to, then the one throwing the ball gets to add a cup BACK IN to their own triangle if one has been removed.

5. Allow players to "rerack" their opponent's formation once per game as the cups disappear.
